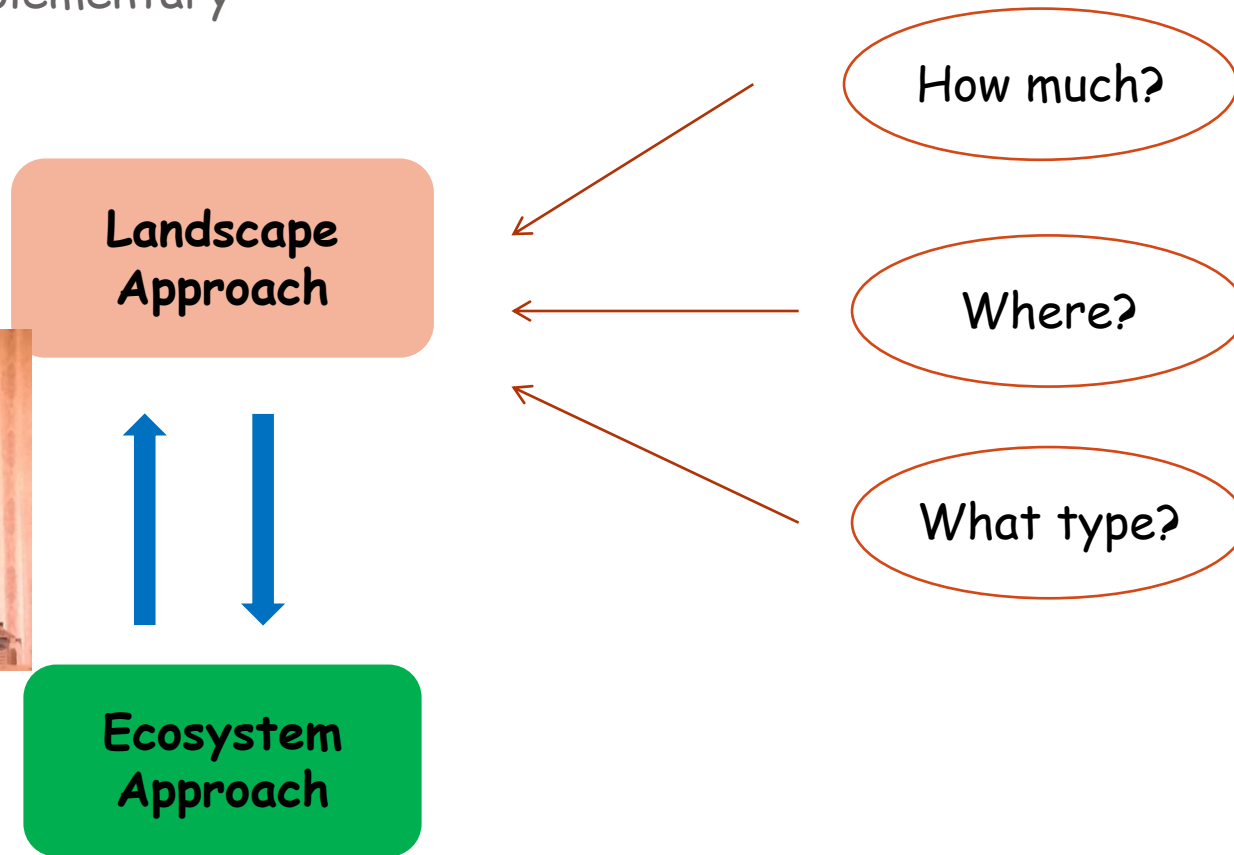

- The **Ecosystem Approach** and the **Landscape Approach** are complementary

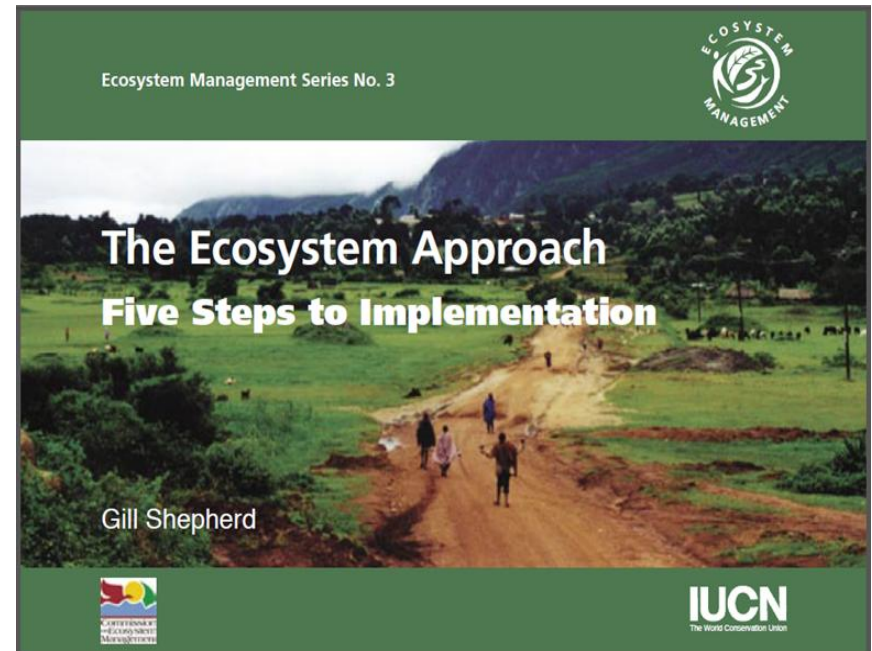

The ecosystem approach to forest rehabilitation - theory and practice  
--- by Prof. David Lamb

## Ecosystem Approach

- Determine the area to be reforest and the main stakeholders involved
- Determine the goods and ecosystem services required and therefore the most suitable types of reforestation
- Identify economic issues affecting stakeholders and how these influence reforestation choices
- Consider landscape context in which reforestation will be done
- Plan for adaptive management to achieve long-term objectives

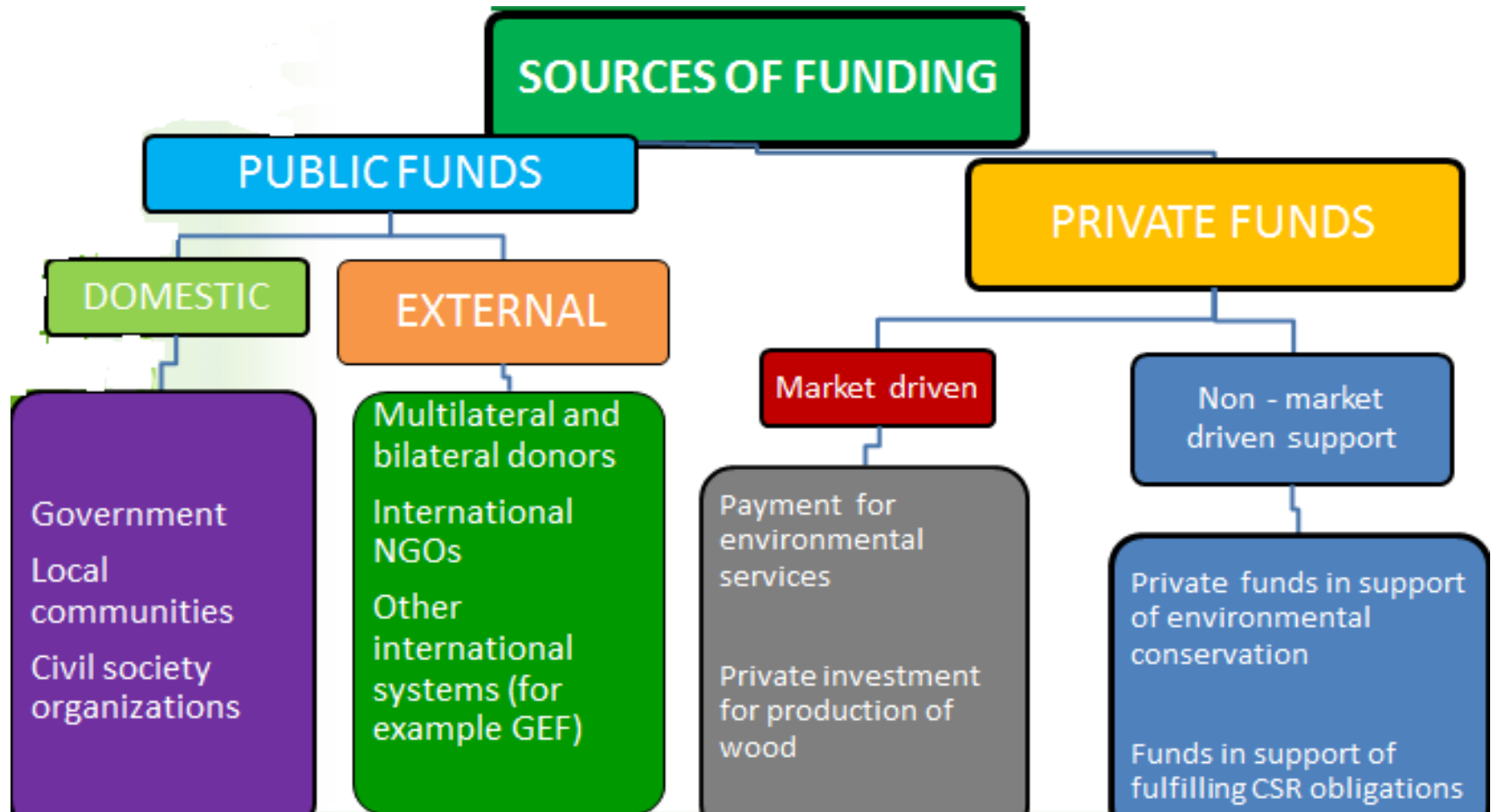

## Policy and Institutional Issues in Ecosystem Rehabilitation

--- by Dr. Unna Chokkalingam

- Questions need to be taken considerations of Rehabilitation Program or Policy: more focus on long-term and practical aspects  
Examples: tenure, financing and capacity building etc.
- Emerging trends
  - High demand for nature resource
  - Volatility & need for diversification
  - Governance structure
  - Land use and change
  - Information-sharing and collaboration
- The way forward across the Asian region



# Key Messages Outlined in Keynote Lecture 4

## The Science and Technology of Forest Rehabilitation

--- by Dr. C.T.S. Nair

- Issues:
  - current technology focus on highly simplified ecosystem
  - very limited multi-functional and farm lands
  - the lack of social science knowledge
- Ecological condition and human dimension (e.g. human behavior) how these work on rehabilitation. How people put these into the practice become critical.
- Issues rising from diverse source of knowledge:
  - e.g. Isolation between actual research and none-doing research
- Indigenous/ traditional knowledge (e.g. narrow focus, site-specific, aspiration of multiple values generations)
- Key barriers: uneven distribution of existing knowledge, weak linkage between institutions and users of research, political and institutional problems etc.
- Emerging challenges and opportunities
