

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Greetings from Kepong, Malaysia!

The year 2020 surprised us with the disastrous impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. From the first few cases reported in China in early December 2019 the new coronavirus has since then been reported in many countries.



The International Symposium Genetic on Conservation and Restoration of Endangered Forest Tree Species in the Asia-Pacific Region was supposed to be held from 16--18 March 2020 in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. The symposium was planned to be organized by the Asia Pacific Forest Genetic Resources Programme (APFORGEN), the Forest Research and Development Agency of Indonesia (FORDA), the Chinese Academy of Forestry, APAFRI and Bioversity International. APAFRI had assisted in making travel arrangements for 14 invited international participants. However. several



participants had to cancel their participations due to travel restriction and it was finally decided that the symposium needed to be postponed until further notice.

In Malaysia, the Movement Control Order (MCO) took effect from 18 March 2020. After seven phases of very strict preventive measures, situation has improved, and the Recovery Movement

Control Order (RMCO) was introduced for a period from 10 June 2020 until 31 August 2020. During the MCO, the Secretariat office was temporary closed and operated on work-from-home basis. All other planned activities need to be put on hold until the situation has improved further.

NIFoS continues its supports to APAFRI with the release of the 2020 Contributions. NIFoS has outlined five activities for 2020:

- International Symposium on Global Forest & Landscape Restoration
- International Workshop on Promoting Legal Timber Trade and Conservation of Forest Genetic Resources in Asia-Pacific Region
- Establishment of ASIA Forest Research Network (AFRN)
- Technical support for the establishment of Forest Tree Breeding Populations for Recovering the Devastated Sites in Cambodia
- Support for Conference and Workshop to Activate the platform on the East Asian Network of Urban Forest (EANUF)

APAFRI is very grateful for the NIFoS continuous contributions which benefited members in improving

their capacity development by participating in the planned activities. As most countries are still under various movement restrictions and travel constraints, these planned activities would not able to be organized until the situations improved.

As reported in the Eighth General Assembly of APAFRI in 2018, the membership of APAFRI had reached 69 institutional members since it was established in 1995. However, current active members totalled 33 which is just half of the total number according to our records. The APAFRI Secretariat would like to update membership status and other details, and will soon send membership update forms to the contact persons. We would appreciate that all members would respond to this updating process in order for us to serve our members more effectively and efficiently.

This would be the last message from me as APAFRI Chairman as I will be officially retired by the end of August. I have been with APAFRI since 2009 and has served as Chairman of APAFRI three times. Over these years, I have witnessed the phenomenal growth of APAFRI to become a prominent association of forestry research organizations in the Asia Pacific region. I would like to convey my appreciations to all the Executive Committee members who have working together with me in leading this association, and also most grateful to all members for supporting APAFRI continuously all these years.

FLASHBACK

When was APAFRI established?

APAFRI was established in 1995. The establishment of APAFRI was prompted by the need to provide a viable institutional framework for research collaboration in the region. Since 1991, the Forestry Research Support Programme for Asia and the Pacific (FORSPA) has been fulfilling the networking function. APAFRI, a follow-up of FORSPA, is an outcome of the desire of the countries in the region and the donor community, to develop a more self-reliant and sustainable mechanism to strengthen research networking. It was launched during the meeting of the Heads of Forestry Research Organizations in the Asia-Pacific held in Bogor, 20-23 February 1995. In a session chaired by Dr. Salleh M. Nor, all representatives approved the constitution of the Association and elected the inaugural Executive Committee of APAFRI with Dr. Suree Bhumibhamon, then with Kasetsart University Thailand, as the first Chairman.

Whose idea proposed the establishment of APAFRI?

The very idea of establishing the association was first mooted by **Dr. Y.S. Rao**, one of the outstanding foresters in the region. He was in-charged of FORSPA, a Food and Agriculture Organization of United Nations (FAO) programme initiated in 1991. FORSPA has been mandated to nurture and support APAFRI in the initial years of the association, with the expectation that APAFRI will become self-supporting before FORSPA ends. He passed away in Bombay in March 1993.



When was the First APAFRI Executive Committee meeting held?

The first meeting of the Executive Committee was held at the FAO Regional Office, Bangkok, Thailand, 5-6 July 1995. In addition to all the members of the Executive Committee, participants to the meeting included representatives from ACIAR, ASEAN Tree Seed Centre, and Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), also participated in the meeting.

When was the First APAFRI General Assembly held?

The First APAFRI General Assembly was held on 26 March 1997 in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

Who was the first Executive Secretary of APAFRI?

Realising the urgency to step up the activities of APAFRI, **Dr. Kamis Awang** from University Putra Malaysia (UPM) was appointed as the Executive Secretary during the First APAFRI General Assembly in 1997.

Location of APAFRI Secretariat

The APAFRI secretariat office was hosted first by the **FAO Regional Office in Bangkok, Thailand**. It was then shifted to the University Putra Malaysia in Serdang, Malaysia in 1997; and has been hosted by FRIM at its Kepong campus since 2001.

What was the impetus for APAFRI development during its early establishment?

In October 1998, APAFRI entered into a CND\$3.5 million agreement with the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) and a CIDA Executing Agency, Salasan Associates of Sidney, British Columbia, Canada to undertake a four year project, the **TREE LINK Project.**

The project's objective was to increase the ability of APAFRI member institutions to contribute to the renewal of Asian forests through the conservation and domestication of indigenous forest resources. The signing of the agreement with CIDA/Salasan provided the impetus for APAFRI to engage two full time employees to administer the day to day operations of the Association. The project formally ended in October 2002.
